# UTW/History

Know some similarities and differences between things in the past and now, drawing on their experiences and what has been read in class.

**Understand chronology** - know some similarities and differences between things in the past and now, drawing on their own experiences. Comment on images of familiar situations from the past. Communicate historically - build up vocabulary that reflects the breadth of their experiences.
