

- Developing my confidence to hold a conversation with peers/teachers

- Learning/singing a repertoire of Nursery Rhymes
- Begin to develop complex stories using small world equipment

- Make imaginative and complex 'small worlds' with blocks and construction kits, such
 as a city with different buildings and a park.
- Join in with dancing and ring games.
- Using masks, puppets, and props to create my own play and stories.

UTW- Understanding the World

- Welly Wednesday -Exploring signs of spring, orienteering, treasure hunt.
- Show interest in different occupations
- Spring celebrations, Shrove Tuesday, Mother's Day and Easter.
- Tour of our school to understand the different spaces/roles within it.
- To be able to talk about a familiar route.
- Notice features in the environment, e.g. street sign, trees, post box
- Making maps of familiar routes and of the school.
- Ask questions about aspects of my familiar world such as the place where I live.

Literacy

- T4W- The 3 Little Pigs
- Creating my own stories with puppets/ props and small world
- Write some or all their name.
- Use some of their print and letter knowledge in their early writing. For example: writing a pretend shopping list that starts at the top of the page; write 'm' for mummy.
- Develop their phonological awareness, so that they can: spot and suggest rhymescount or clap syllables in a word- recognise words with the same initial sound, such as money and mother
